### Changes for the Transit Authority

Butler, PA – As of Wednesday, November 1, 2006 the Butler Township-City Joint Municipal Transit Authority will officially change its name to the Butler Transit Authority. The name modification comes as the Authority experiences a number of changes.

The Authority broke ground on its Intermodal Transit Center on October 30<sup>th</sup> with Senator Rick Santorum as the keynote speaker. The Intermodal Center will serve as a main terminal for local buses with an indoor waiting area, and a transfer center for taxis and buses to Pittsburgh. In addition to the terminal, the Intermodal Center will serve as a maintenance and storage facility for the buses as well as the offices for the Authority. The facility will also house the County of Butler's BART fleet and operations for the rural transportation demand response service.

The Butler Transit Authority is also hopeful that transit to Southwest Butler County will be implemented in the near future. Cranberry Township, Zelienople Borough, Jackson Township, Harmony Borough, and Evans City Borough have already signed on to the project.

In addition to the projects in the works, the Authority has implemented a new logo and re-designed schedules and maps. Schedules and maps are available at the terminal on East Cunningham Street in Butler. The new logo will appear on the Authority's new buses, arriving Spring of 2007.
