## FACT bus to begin Pittsburgh run

Beginning Oct. 2, Fayette Area Coordinated Transportation will begin public transit service to downtown Pittsburgh Monday through Friday.

Passengers will be picked up only in Fayette County, at the FACT Park & Ride lot, the Route 51 Fayette Plaza area, Busters Restaurant and the McDonald's area at the Star Junction intersection of Route 51.

The handicapped-accessible buses will travel Route 51 to downtown Pittsburgh by way of the Wabash Tunnel and Smithfield Street to the terminal at Penn Station, Grant Street and Liberty Avenue.

Six trips a day will be provided, starting at 5:45 a.m. and arriving at Penn Station at 7:45 a.m. Subsequent one-way, two-hour trips will leave Fayette County at 6:45 a.m., 9:35 a.m., 10:35 a.m., 2 p.m. and 3 p.m.

Return trips to Fayette County will depart Penn Station at 7:45 a.m., 8:45 a.m., 11:55 a.m., 12:55 p.m., 4:05 p.m. and 5:05 p.m.

The one-way trip fares range from \$5 to \$7. People with disabilities may ride at half fare during non-peak hours. Monthly passes may be purchased from \$165 to \$231, depending on the pickup location.
